EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF LAWS (LL.B) (3 YEARS COURSE) [NEW CREDIT BASED SYSTEM], DIRECTION, 2019.

[Direction issued by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016, hereinafter referred to as the "Act"] (Maharashtra Act No.VI of 2017)

AND

WHEREAS, there is need to make the 3 Year Degree of Bachelor of Laws (LL.B) more compatible with the Legal Education Rules, 2008 framed by the Bar Council of India, New Delhi.

AND

WHEREAS, the Board of Studies in Law in its meeting dated 28.02.2019 and subsequent meeting dated 29.03.2019 revised the syllabus of law courses both for 3 years and 5 years on the basis of "New Credit Based System" to be implemented from the academic year 2019-20.

AND

WHEREAS, the same necessitates the repeal of the Direction No. 7 of 2012 and Direction No. 7 of 2019.

AND

WHEREAS, the procedure of implementing the new syllabus is urgent and emergent, due to repeal and amendments as well as introduction of new statutes in last five years it has become necessary to upgrade the existing syllabus in order to keep pace with the change in the field of legal studies. So also, as the Government of Maharashtra has introduced Common Entrance Test in Law for Admissions in the LL.B. (3 Year Course) and B.A. LL.B. (5 Year Course) through Centralized Admission Process in the year 2016-2017, it has become necessary to change the existing Direction.

Now, therefore, I, Dr. Siddharhthvinayaka Kane, Vice-Chancellor, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Nagpur, in the exercise of the powers vested in me under Section 12 (8) of the Act,do hereby issue the following Direction:



- 1. **Title of the Direction**: This Direction shall be called "Examinations leading to the award of the Degree of Bachelor of laws (L.L.B)(3 years course) [New Credit Based System], Direction, 2019."
- 2. Commencement of the Direction: (a) It shall come into force from the academic year 2019-20.
- 3 .Duration of the Program: The duration of the program is 3 academic years, spread over 6 semesters, with a University Examination at the end of each Semester. Each Academic Year shall be divided into two semesters.

An examination for each of the semesters shall be held twice in a year at such places and on such dates as may be fixed by the University. The fees for the examination shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.

The courses/papers and credits assigned to each course in each semester shall be as given in Appendix-I.

4. Definitions:

New Credit Based System (NCBS): The NCBS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses wherever options are provided in the course/papers prescribed for this program in appendix-I

Course: It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a semester. It is a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester.

Credit: Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly clock hours assigned to a Course.

Credit Point (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.

Credit Transfer: The credit acquired for the courses in another University would be accepted on reciprocal basis subject to the UGC Norms inforce from time to time.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters.

Grade Point: Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper



Grade Letter: Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O,A,B,C,D,E and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade.

Grade Letter Average: refers to the Grade Letter awarded after summing up external and internal marks obtained in each course/paper.

Program: It means in this particular context, a THREE year Program of study and examination spread over SIX semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of LL.B 3 year course degree.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. It is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

5. Eligibility Criteria for Admission: (a) Admission to the program shall be made by Centralised Admission Process, through Common Entrance Test in Law conducted by Government of Maharashtra and in accordance with the rules and instructions provided from time to time in this regard by the Government of Maharashtra, R.T.M. Nagpur University and Bar Council of India.

The reservation policy and rules of the Government of Maharashtra governing admission to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall also be followed.

- (b) An applicant who has successfully completed Graduation(10+2+3) or equivalent from a recognized University of India or outside, recognised by the Union Government or by a State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate, on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the LL.B. 3 Year Degree Programme.
- (c) Students who secure minimum 45% of the total marks in the qualifying examination are eligible for admission into the Program.
- (d) For S.C. & S.T. students minimum 40% of the total marks in their qualifying examination is required for admission into the Program.

With this eligibility a student may be admitted through Centralised Admission Process of Government of Maharashtra. However a student seeking admission as per Absorption Scheme under this Direction shall be admitted directly to the relevant semester to which he is entitled under this scheme.

- 6. **Medium of Instruction**: The medium of instruction and Examination shall be in English. Question papers for the examination shall be set in English. However, the candidates will have an option to write their answers either in English, Hindi or Marathi.
- 7. **Attendance**: No student shall be permitted to appear for the Semester Examination unless he/she has put in not less than 75% attendance of the classes held in any course/paper concerned



including tutorials, moot court exercises, practical training etc. conducted in respect of that course/paper, however, Principal/Head of the Department/Director of the college/institution, department shall have power to condone the absence on sufficient cause maximum upto 15% in order to allow the student to appear in university examination.

8. Rules of Promotion: Rules of Promotion from one semester to another semester are as follows:

From I to II - A Student should have undergone regular course of study and appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-I.

From II to III a) A Student should have undergone regular course of study and appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-II, and;

b) the number of backlogs, if any, of Semester I and II taken together shall not exceed 5(five) courses/papers prescribed for Semester I and II.

From III to IV: A Student should have undergone regular course of study and appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-III.

From IV to V a) A Student Should have undergone regular course of study and appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-IV, and;

- b) A Student must have passed all the papers/course of Semester I and II, and;
- c) the number of backlogs, if any, of Semester III and IV taken together shall not exceed 5 (five) courses/papers.

From V to VI: A Student should have undergone regular course of study and appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-V

- 9. **Instruction, Training and Teaching Work Load**: Each Semester shall comprise of not less than 15weeks with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercises and seminars. A class-hours shall consist of 48 minutes duration.
- a) Each theory and Clinical paper shall carry a credit of 4, which means there shall be 5 classes per week each of 48 minutes duration. In addition to this, for each theory and clinical paper there shall be per week minimum one class hour for tutorial/Seminar/Group discussion / internal examinations/ Presentation / Guest lecture etc. This weekly exercise shall be carried out by the concerned teacher and the same shall be counted for his/her weekly work load.
- b) Distribution of 20 marks for internal assessment, wherever there is a provision for internal assessment, it shall be as follows:
- i) Internal/Sessional Examination = 5marks
- ii) Class attendance and participation = 5marks



- iii)Assignments /viva Voce= 5 marks
- iv) Presentation/Seminar/Group Discussion = 5 marks
- (c) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 12 weeks of internshipduring the entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, other LegalFunctionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies and Local Self Government.
- (d) The internship in any Semester cannot be for a continuous period of more than FourWeeks and the internship program will commence from 3rdsemester onwards. Each student shall keep internship diary and the sameshall be signed by the Guide in Internship and also by an assigned Faculty member of thecollege. The internship program may be undertaken even during the after-semester vacations, before commencement of sixth semester examinations. The evaluation of internship record shall be done by an external examiner appointed by the University for the 3rd Clinical paper, i.e. Moot Court in the Sixth Semester of the course as stipulated in Appendix-I. For the purpose of award of marks for Internship, it shall be considered to be part of Clinical Paper III and shall carry 30 Marks.
- 10. Evaluation System on the basis of Credit based Award Pattern: Based on his/her continuous evaluation, the academic performance of a student during a semester shall be graded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/her performance in theory and internal/sessional examinations.
- (a) The academic performance of a student during a semester and at the end of the program, shall be evaluated on the basis of:
- (i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject
- (ii) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA),
- (iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)
- (b) Marks for Extra Curricular Components (E.C.C) are to be awarded at the end of eacheven semester in recognition of achievements in sports/cultural/N.S.S/NCC as per therules and instructions of the University provided in this regard from time to time. Themarks shall be used for upgrading CGPA.
- (c) At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester GradePoint Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded toeach student at the end of Final Semester of the Program. The details regardingmethod of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in detail in para 10.
- 11. Awards of Grade Letter, Grade Points, Credit Points, SGPA, CGPA:
- (a) Award of Grade Letter and Grade Points:



Each course/paper shall be valued in Seven Grades. The letter grades andtheir equivalent grade points are listed below.

- (b) Calculation of Credit Points: Credit Points for the course = No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Point secured for that course.
- (c) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points.

SGPA= Total Credit Points obtained in the Semester/ Total Number of Credits for the Semester

Provided that SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the courses (gets a minimum 'E' Grade in all Courses).

(d) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighed across all the semesters.

CGPA = Total Credit Points Obtained in all Semesters/Total Credits of all Semesters

Provided that CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the courses of all the semesters. CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points.

- 12. Standard of Passing the Semester Examinations: In order to pass a particular examination, a candidate shall have to secure at least 40% of marks in each and every Theory and Practical/Clinical paper in the end semester examination, taken together with internal assessment marks in each paper. However, to be declared as pass in the end semester examination or for seeking exemption in any individual subject, the candidate needs to secure at least 50% marks in the aggregate of the semester or in the individual subject in which exemption is sought.
- 13. Award of the Degree: A student will be eligible for the award of LL.B (3 Year) Degree only when he has successfully completed all the prescribed 32 papers with a total of 128credits and



obtained a minimum CGPA of 5.00 out of 10.00 and after payment of prescribed fee to receive a degree signed by the Vice-Chancellor. The result of the successful candidates shall be classified as follows:

i. First Division with Distinction: CGPA from 8.00 and above

ii. First Division: CGPA from 6.67 to 7.99 iii. Second Division: CGPA from 5.56 to 6.66 Iv. Pass Division: CGPA from 5.00 to 5.55

14. Conversion of CGPA into Percentage of Marks: The formula used in this Direction to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA is Percentage = 9 x CGPA.

The average highest marks in LL.B course is taken as close to 90 marks. Hence 9 is taken as the multiple to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA.

15. **Award of Medals and Merit Certificates**: Candidates who appear and pass the examination in all the papers of each and every semester at first appearance only are eligible for the award of Medals/Prizes/Rank Certificates etc. The marks allotted for Extra Curricular Components shall be taken into account for deciding the inter se merit as well as the award of medals and prizes.

16. Repeal and Saving:

After the coming into force of this Direction, the Direction No. 7 of 2019 incorporating the provisions of Direction No. 7 of 2012 shall stand repealed. However, Notwithstanding the repeal of the said Direction all the students who have taken admission under the said Direction or the lapsed Direction 7 of 2012 shall continue to be governed by those Direction till the academic year 2020-21. All those students who fail to complete their course successfully will get attempts till Summer 2023 examination. If even after exhausting the grace period any student has the backlog of any paper(s) he/she will have to seek admissions in the new course governed by this Direction by claiming exemption in the papers which he/she has already passed. In no case, however, there shall be two courses one under the repealed Direction(s) and another under this Direction, offered by any college. After the commencement of the new course under this Direction no students of any earlier three years course, other than the course governed by the Direction No.7 of 2019 or 7 of 2012, shall be entitled to seek absorption under this Direction. All such students desiring to take admission in the LLB three years course shall seek admission as a fresh student, through CET conducted by Director of Higher Education, Maharashtra.

Credit: Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly Clock hours assigned to a Course.

Credit Point (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.

Credit Transfer: The credit acquired for the courses in another University would be accepted on reciprocal basis subject to the UGC Norms in force from time to time.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighed across all the semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters.



Grade Point: Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper

Grade Letter: Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O,A,B,C,D,E and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade.

Grade Letter Average: refers to the Grade Letter awarded after summing up external and internal marks obtained in each course/paper.

Programme: It means in this particular context, a FIVE year Programme of study and examination spread over TEN semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of B.A.LL.B 5years course degree.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. It is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

5. Eligibility Criteria for Admission: (a) Admission to the program shall be made by Centralised Admission Process, through Common Entrance Test in Law conducted by Government of Maharashtra and in accordance with the rules and instructions provided from, time to time in this regard by the Government of Maharashtra, R.T.M. Nagpur University and Bar Council of India.

The reservation policy and rules of the Government of Maharashtra governing admission to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall also be followed.

- (b) An applicant who has successfully completed 10+2 or Intermediate or equivalent from a recognized University ofIndia or outside or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by a StateGovernment or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that countryfor the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admittedinto the B.A. LL.B. (5 Years) Degree Course.
- (c) Students who secure minimum 45% of the total marks in the qualifying examination are eligible for admission into the Programme.
- (d) For S.C. & S.T. students minimum 40% of the total marks in their qualifying examination is required for admissioninto the Programme.

With this eligibility a student may be admitted through Centralized Admission Process of Government of Maharashtra. However a student seeking admission as per Absorption Scheme under this Direction shall be admitted directly to the relevant semester to which he is entitled under this scheme.

6. **Medium of Instruction**: The medium of instruction and Examination shall be in English. Question papers for the examination shall be set in English. However, the candidates will have an option to write their answers either in English, Hindi or Marathi.



- 7. Attendance: No student shall be permitted to appear for the Semester Examination unless he/she has put in not less than 75% attendance of the classes held in any course/paper concerned including tutorials, moot court exercises, practical training etc. conducted in respect of that course/paper.However, Principal/Head of the Department/Director of the college/institution, department shall have power to condone the absence, on sufficient cause, maximum upto 15% in order to allow the student to appear in university examination.
- 8. Rules of Promotion: Rules of Promotion from one semester to another semester are as follows:-

From I to II - A Student should have undergone regular course of study and appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-I.

From II to III a) A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-II, and;

b) the number of backlogs, if any, of Semester I and II taken together shall not exceed 5(five) courses/papers (50 %) prescribed for Semester I and II.

From III to IV: A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-III.

From IV to V a) A Student Should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical Examination of Semester-IV,

- b) the student must have passed all the papers/courses prescribed for Semester I and Semester II examination, and
- c) the number of backlogs, if any, of Semester III and IV taken together shall not exceed 5 (five) courses/papers(i.e. 50% of papers prescribed).

From V to VI: A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory Examination of Semester-V

From VI to VII: a) A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory Examination of Semester-VI; and

- b) The student must have passed all the papers/courses prescribed for Semester I to Semester IV examinations; and
- c) The number of backlogs, if any, of Semester V and VI taken together shall not exceed 5 (five) courses/papers (i.e. 50% of papers prescribed).

From VII to VIII: A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical/ClinicalExamination of Semester-VII



From VIII to IX: a) A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical/Clinical Examination of Semester-VIII; and

- b) A Student must passed all the papers/course of Semester I to Semester VI; and
- c) The backlogs, if any, of Semester VII and VIII taken together shall not exceed 5 (five) courses/papers. (i.e. 50% of papers prescribed).

From IX to X: a) A Student should have undergone regular course of studyand appeared for Sessionals or/and University Theory/Practical/Clinical Examination of Semester-IX

- 9. Instruction, Training and Teaching Work Load: Each Semester shall comprise of not less than 15weeks with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercises and seminars. A class-hour shall consist of 48 minutes duration.
- a) Each theory and Clinical paper shall carry a credit of 4, which means there shall be 5 classes per week each of 48 minutes duration. In addition to this, for each theory and clinical paper there shall be per week minimum one class hour for tutorial/Seminar/Group discussion / internal examinations/ Presentation / Guest lecture etc. This weekly exercise shall be carried out by the concerned teacher and the same shall be counted for his/her weekly work load.
- b) Distribution of 20 marks for internal assessment, wherever there is a provision for internal assessment, it shall be as follows:
- i) Internal/Sessional Examination = 5marks
- ii) Class attendance and participation = 5marks
- iv) Assignments /viva Voce= 5 marks
- iv) Presentation/Seminar/GroupDiscussion=5 marks
- (c) Each registered student shall have completed minimum of 12 weeks of internshipduring the entire period of legal studies under NGO, Trial and Appellate Advocates, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, other LegalFunctionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies and Local Self Government.
- (d) The internship in any Semester cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and the Internship Programme will commence from 7thsemester onwards. Each student shall keep internship diary and the sameshall be signed by the Guide in Internship and also by a assigned Faculty member of the college. The internship program may be undertaken even during the after-semester vacations, before commencement of Tenth semester examinations. The evaluation of internship record shall be done by an external examiner appointed by the University for the 3rd Clinical paper, i.e. Moot Court in the Tenth Semester of the course as



stipulated in Appendix-I. For the purpose of award of marks for Internship, it shall be considered to be part of Clinical Paper – III and shall carry 30 Marks.

- 10. Evaluation System on the basis of Credit based Award Pattern: Based on his/hercontinuous evaluation, the academic performance of a student during a semester shall begraded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/herperformance in external and internal examinations.
- (a) The academic performance of a student during a semester and at the end of theprogramme, shall be evaluated on the basis of:
- (i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject
- (ii) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA),
- (iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)
- (b) Marks for Extra Curricular Components (E.C.C) are to be awarded at the end of each even semester in recognition of achievements in sports/cultural/N.S.S/NCC as per therules and instructions of the University provided in this regard from time to time. Themarks shall be used for upgrading CGPA.
- (c) At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester GradePoint Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded toeach student at the end of Final Semester of the Programme. The details regardingmethod of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in detail in para 10.

11. Awards of Grade Letter, Grade Points, Credit Points, SGPA, CGPA:

(a) Award of Grade Letter and Grade Points:

Each course/paper shall be valued in Seven Grades. The letter grades andtheir equivalent grade points are listed below.

- (b) Calculation of Credit Points: Credit Points for the course = No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Point secured for that course.
- (c) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points.

SGPA= Total Credit Points in the Semester

Total Number of Credits for the Semester

Provided that SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the courses (gets a minimum 'E' Grade in all Courses).

(d) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighed across all the semesters.

CGPA = Total Credit Points Obtained in all Semesters

Total Credits of all Semesters

Provided that CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the courses of all the semesters. CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points.

- 12. **Standard of Passing the Semester Examinations**: In order to qualify a particular examination, a candidate shall have to secure at least 40% of marks in each and every theory and Practical/Clinical paper in the end semester examination, taken together with internal assessment marks in each paper. However, to be declared as pass in the end semester examination or for seeking exemption in any individual subject, the candidate needs to secure at least 50% marks in the aggregate of the semester or in the individual subject in which exemption is sought.
- 13. **Award of the Degree:** A student will be eligible for the award of B.A. LL.B (5 Year) Degree only when he has successfully completed all the prescribed 50 papers with a total of 200 credits and obtained a minimum CGPA of 5.00 out of 10.00 and after payment of prescribed fee to receive a degree signed by the Vice-Chancellor. The result of the successful candidates shall be classified as follows:

i. First Division with Distinction: CGPA from 8.00 and above

ii. First Division: CGPA from 6.67 to 7.99 iii. Second Division: CGPA from 5.56 to 6.66 Iv. Pass Division: CGPA from 5.00 to 5.55



14. Conversion of CGPA into Percentage of Marks: The formula used in this direction to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA is Percentage = $9 \times CGPA$.

The average highest marks in B.A.LL.B course is taken as close to 90 marks. Hence 9 is taken as multiple to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA.

15. Award of Medals and Merit Certificates: Candidates who appear and pass the examination in all the papers of each and every semester at first appearance only are eligible for the award of Medals/Prizes/Rank Certificates etc. The marks allotted for Extra Curricular Components shall be taken into account for deciding the inter se merit as well as the award of medals and prizes.

16. Repeal and Saving:

After the coming into force of this Direction the Direction No. 8 of 2019 incorporating the provisions of Direction No. 34 of 2012 shall stand repealed. However, Notwithstandingthe repeal of the said Direction all the students who have taken admission under the said Direction or the lapsed Direction 34 of 2012 shall continue to be governed by those Direction till the academic year 2022-23. All those students who fail to complete their course successfully will get attempts till Summer 2025 examination. If even after exhausting the grace period any student has the backlog of any paper(s) he/she will have to seek admissions in the new course governed by this Direction by claiming exemption in the papers which he/she has already passed. In no case, however, there shall be two courses, one under the repealed Direction(s) and another under this After the commencement of the new course under this Direction, offered by any college. Direction no students of any earlier five years course, other than the course governed by the Direction No.8 of 2019 or 34 of 2012, shall be entitled to seek absorption under this Direction. All such students desiring to take admission in the B.A. LLB five years course shall seek admission as a fresh student, through CET conducted by Director of Higher Education, Maharashtra.

Illustration: If a student 'A' has taken admission in B.A.LL.B. (5 Years Course) in the year 2017-2018 AND in the 2018-2019 is in 2nd Year (i.e. Semester III and Semester IV) where he is declared failed and could not secure admission in next semester/year even on the basis A.T.K.T., such student subsequently, in the year 2021-22 become eligible for admission in the 3rd Year of the B.A.LL.B. (5 Year Course) but by that time New Credit Based Course has reached 3rd Year of B.A.LL.B. (5 Year Course) then such student shall be absorbed in New Course as per Absorption scheme framed under this direction. At no point of time College will conduct two courses for the same semester as regular courses under this direction and earlier direction.

[Direction issued by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor under Section 12(8) of the M.P.U.Act, 2016] (Maharashtra Act No.VI of 2017)

AND

WHERE AS there is need to make the 3 Years Degree of Bachelor of Law (LL.B) more compatible with the Legal Education Rules 2008 framed by the Bar Council of India, New Delhi.

AND

WHERE AS the Dean of the Faculty of Humanities requested the Vice-Chancellor of R.T.M Nagpur University to approve the new syllabus based on Credit Based Semester System under Section 12(8) of Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 to meet the exigency.

AND

WHERE AS the same necessitates to revive the Direction No. 7 of 2012.

AND

Whereas University has adopted the Direction No. 13 of 2017 in order to bring uniformity regarding rules of evaluation and promotion in all the faculties of the University.

AND

WHERE AS the Government of Maharashtra has introduced Common Entrance Test in Law for Admissions in the LL.B. (3 Years Course) and B.A. LL.B. (5 Years Course) through Centralised Admission Process in the year 2016-2017, it has become necessary to change the existing direction.

Now, therefore, I, Dr. Siddharhthvinayaka Kane, Vice-Chancellor, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Nagpur inexercise of the powers vested in me under Section 12 (8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act,2016 do hereby issue the following Direction:

- 1. Title of the Direction: This direction shall be called "Direction leading to the examination for award of the 3 years degree of Bachelor of laws (LL.B.)(CreditBased Semester System) in the faculty of Humanities, subject law, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Nagpur.
- 2. Commencement of the Direction: (a) It shall come into force from the academic year2017-18.



3. Duration of the Programme: The duration of the programme is 3 academic years whichspread over 6 semesters with the University Examination at the end of each Semester. Each Academic Year shall be divided into Two semesters.

The reservation policy and rules of the Government of Maharashtra governing admission to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall also be followed.

- 5. Medium of Instruction: The medium of instruction and Examination shall be in English. Question papers for the examination shall be set in English. However, the candidates will have an option to write their answers either in English, Hindi or Marathi.
- 6. Attendance: No student shall be permitted to appear for the Semester Examination unless he/she has put in not less than 75% attendance of the classes held in any course/paper concerned including tutorials, moot court exercises, practical training etc. conducted in respect of that paper/course.
- 7. RULES OF PROMOTION: Rules of Promotion are as under:

- 8. Instruction, Training and Teaching Work Load: Each Semester shall comprise of not less than 15weeks with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot room exercises and seminarsprovided there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week.

- b) The number of classes for theory and practical courses/papers per week must be equal to number of credits shown against the paper as indicated in the course structure or as indicated in the Appendix-I.

The total marks shall be assessed in the Final Semester of the course inthe 4th Clinical paper as stipulated in the Appendix-I..
- 9. Evaluation System on the basis of Credit based Award Pattern: Based on his/hercontinuous evaluation, the academic performance of a student during a semester shall begraded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/herperformance in external and internal examinations.
- (a) The academic performance of a student during a semester and at the end of theprogramme, shall be evaluated on the basis of:
- (i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject
- (ii) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA),
- (iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)



- (b) Marks for Extra Curricular Components (E.C.C) are to be awarded at the end of eacheven semester in recognition of achievements in sports/cultural/N.S.S/NCC as per therules and instructions of the University provided in this regard from time to time. Themarks shall be used for upgrading CGPA.
- (c) At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester GradePoint Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded toeach student at the end of Final Semester of the Programme. The details regardingmethod of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in detail in para 10.
- 10. Awards of Grade Letter, Grade Points, Credit Points, SGPA, CGPA:

Provided that CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the courses of all the semesters. CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points.

- 11. Standard of Passing the Semester Examinations: In order to qualify a particular examination, a candidate shall have to secure at least 45% of marks in each and every theory and Practical/Clinical paper in the end semester examination, theory and internal assessment marks, separately, in each paper. However, to be declared pass in the end semester examination or for seeking exemption in any individual subject student need to secure at least 50% marks in aggregate of the semester or in individual subject in which exemption is sought.
- 12. Betterment: Students may be allowed to repeat any two of the theory papers of the last semester while in the next semester for betterment of marks and grades provided the student secures less than 60% marks in that paper. No betterment shall be allowed in the internal assessment and in practical/clinical papers in any semester. A student who opts for betterment will be disqualified from being considered for award of Medals, Merit, Ranks etc.
- 13. Award of the Degree: A student will be eligible for the award of LL.B (3 Years) Degree only when he has successfully completed all the prescribed 32 papers with a total of 128 credits and obtained a minimum CGPA of 5.00 out of 10.00 and after payment of prescribed fee for receive a degree signed by the Vice-chancellor. The result of the successful candidates shall be classified as follows:

i. First Division with Distinction: CGPA from 8.00 and above

ii. First Division: CGPA from 6.67 to 7.99

iii. Second Division: CGPA from 5.56 to 6.66

Iv. Pass Division: CGPA from 5.00 to 5.55

14. Conversion of CGPA into Percentage of Marks: The formula used in this direction to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA is Percentage = 9 x CGPA.

The average highest marks in LL.B course is taken as close to 90 marks. Hence 9 is taken as multiple to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA.



15. Award of Medals and Merit Certificates: Candidates who appear and pass the examination in all the papers of each and every semester at first appearance only are eligible for the award of Medals/Prizes/Rank Certificates etc. The marks allotted for Extra Curricular Components shall be taken into account for deciding the inter se Merit as well as the award of medals and prizes.

WHEREAS the Board of Studies in Law in its meeting dated 07-09-2011 and subsequent meeting dated 14-09-2011 revised the syllabus of law courses both for 3 years and 5 years on the basis of "Credit Based Semester System" to be implemented from the academic year 2012-13;

AND

WHEREAS the Faculty of Law at its meeting held on 27-1-2012 approved the said syllabus prepared by the Board of Studies in Law;

AND

WHEREAS the Dean of the Faculty requested the Vice-Chancellor of R.T.M Nagpur University to approve the new syllabus based on Credit Based Semester System under Section 14(7) of Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994 (Since repealed) to meet the exigency;

WHEREAS the Board of Studies in Law in its meeting dated 63/11/18 has resolved to revive the lapsed Direction no. 34 of 2012 with necessary changes regarding admission of new students and absorption of old students from the academic year 2017-18;

WHEREAS the Dean of the Faculty of Humanities Dr.Shrikant Komawar requested the Vice-Chancellor of R.T.M Nagpur University to approve the revival of the lapsed Direction no. 34 of 2012 with necessary changes suggested by the Board of Studies in Law;

- 1. Title of the Direction: This direction shall be called "Direction leading to the examination for award of the Degree of Bachelor of Laws (5 years program) (New Credit Based Semester System) in the faculty of Law, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Nagpur.
- 2. Commencement of the Direction: (a) It shall come into force from the academic year 2018-19.
- 3. Duration of the Programme: The duration of the programme is 5 academic years which spread over 10 semesters with the University Examination at the end of each Semester. Each Academic Year shall be divided into Two semesters.

An examination for each of the semester shall be held twice in a year at such places and on such dates as may be fixed by the University. The fees for the examination shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.

The courses/papers and credits assigned to the course shall be as given in the Appendix-1.

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4. Definitions:

Course: It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a semester. It is a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester.

Credit: Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly class hours assigned to a Course.

Credit Point (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.

Credit Transfer: The credit acquired for the courses in another University would be accepted on reciprocal basis subject to the UGC Norms.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPS): CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters.

Grade Point: Grade Point is weight allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper

Grade Letter: Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O,A,B,C,D,E and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade.

Grade Letter Average: refers to the Grade Letter awarded after summing up external and internal marks obtained in each course/paper.

Programme: It means, in this particular context, a FIVE year Programme of study and examination spread over sin semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of B.A.LL.B 5 years course degree.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. It is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

5. Eligibility Criteria for Admission: (a) Admission to the program shall be made by Centralised Admission Process of Maharashtra State through Common Entrance Test in Law accordance with the rules and instructions provided from to time to time in this regard by the Maharashtra State, R.T.M. Nagpur University and Bar Council of India.

A student who opts for betterment will be disqualified from being considered for award of Medals. Merit, Ranks etc.
- 17. Award of the Degree: A student will be eligible for the award of B.A. LL.B (5 Years) Degree only when he has successfully completed all the prescribed 50 papers with a total ofcredits and obtained a minimum CGPA of 5.00 out of 10.00 and after payment of prescribed fee for receive a degree signed by the Vice-chancellor. The result of the successful candidates shall be classified as follows:
- i. First Division with Distinction: CGPA from 8.00 and above

i. First Division: CGPA from 6.67 to 7.99

iii. Second Division: CGPA from 5.56 to 6.66

Iv. Pass Division: CGPA from 5.00 to 5.55

18. Conversion of CGPA into Percentage of Marks: The formula used in this direction to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA is Percentage = 9 x CGPA.

The average highest marks in B.A.LL.B course is taken as close to 90 marks. Hence 9 is taken as multiple to calculate percentage of marks from CGPA.

19. Award of Medals and Merit Certificates: Candidates who appear and pass the examination in all the papers of each and every semester at first appearance only are eligible for the award of Medals/Prizes/Rank Certificates etc. The marks allotted for Extra Curricular Components shall taken into account for deciding the inter se Merit as well as the award of medals and prizes.

ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF DEGREE OF MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M.)

(CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM) UNDER THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES, DIRECTION 2019.

(Direction issued by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities. Act, 2016).

WHEREAS, The Maharashtra Public Universities Act No. 6 of 2016 (Act VI of 2017) (hereinafter referred as an Act) has come into force with effect from 1st March, 2017;

AND

WHEREAS, the choice based credit system was introduced in the LL.M. course from the academic session 2016-17, vide Direction No. 61 of 2016:

AND

WHEREAS, the University has further issued Direction No. 14 of 2017 to repeal and replace the Direction No. 61 of 2016 to remove the difficulties caused due to introduction of the Direction 61 of 2016;

AND:

WHEREAS, since the Direction No. 14 of 2017 could not be converted into an Ordinance within six months of its issuance, the same had lapsed by virtue ofproviso to section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public University Act 2016necessitating issuance of a new Direction incorporating the provisions of Direction No.14 of 2017 with suitable modifications arising out of issuance of a common Direction by the university prescribing common rules of A.T.K.T.;

Now, therefore, I, Dr. Siddharthvinayak P. Kane, Vice-Chancellor, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Nagpur in exercise of the powers vested in me under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Universities Act, VI of 2017 do hereby issue the following Direction No . of 2019:

- Title of the Direction: "ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF DEGREE OF MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M.) (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM) UNDER THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES, DIRECTION 2019."
- 2. Commencement and applicability of the Direction: It shall come into force from the date of its issuance.
- 3. Scope: This Direction shall apply to LL.M. Regular Course Studentsonly.
- 4. Duration of the Programme: The duration of the LL.M programme shall be TWO academic years spread over FOUR semesters with the University Examinations at theendofeachSemester.EachAcademicYearshallconsistofTwoSemesters.The academic session will commence as per the calendar published by the university. An examination for each of the semester shall be held twice in a year at such places and on such dates as may be notified by the University from time to time. The fees for the examination also shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- 5. Interpretation Clause :Unless the context otherwise require, the following words shall have the meaning as assigned to them in this clause.
 - a) Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academicyear.
 - **b)** ATKT: means Allowed to Keep Term in Higher Semester as per the provisions of this Direction.
 - c) "Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): Choice Based Credit System provides Choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor Or soft skilled courses)"(See Appendix I attached with this Direction)."
 - d) Course: It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a programme. It is a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester. All courses need not carry the same weight. A course may be designed to comprise lecturing/tutorial/laboratory work/fieldwork/outreach activities/project work/vocationaltraining/viva/seminars/termpapers/assignments/presentations/self -study etc. or a combination of some ofthese.
 - e) Credit: Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly clock hours assigned to a Course. One Credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching work (Lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work perweek.
 - Credit Point (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for thatcourse.

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- g) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA means the value obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters. It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over allsemesters.
- h) Grade Letter: Grade Letter means an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper into a letter grade. There shall be a range of marks for each Grade.
- i) Grade Point: Grade Point means weightage allotted to each gradeletter.
- j) Programme: It means the Two Year Post Graduate Programme of study and examination spread over four semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of Master of Laws (LL.M.)degree.
- **k)** Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It means the value obtained by dividing the total credit points earned by a student in all the courses of a given semester by the total number of credits assigned to that semester. It is a measure of performance of work done in asemester.
- Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate: Based on the grade earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till thatsemester.
- m) University :- It means Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University.
- 6. Eligibility Criteria for Admission: An applicant for admission to LL. M. programme should have obtained Bachelors Degree in Law (LL.B.) (Three Years) or B.A. LL.B. (Five Years) or any other equivalent degree by whatever name called either of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University or any other recognized University in India or abroad.
- 7. Procedure of Admission:- The admission to the entry level semester shall be through the Centralized Admission Procedure implemented by the University.
- 8. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS AND EXAMINATION :The medium of instruction and examination for LL.M Course shall be English only.
- 9. CHOICE BASED CREDITCOURSE: College
 - i) Every student taking admission as a regular student in the first semester of

LL.M. course shall have to opt for anyone of the seven specialization enumerated in Appendix-I and which may be offered in the institution where the applicant student desire to take admission. The studentwillnotbeallowedtochangehischoiceofspecialization. The detailofthecour secontent for each specialization shall be as per the various tables mentioned in the said Appendix.

- ii) Each student of LL.M. course has to select and study one elective core course paper in third and fourth semester from the list of the electives provided for each semester or in the alternative the student can choose any one foundational course from the list of 41 foundational courses excluding the foundational course in law. The chosen foundational course will have one paper each in the third and fourth semester as shown in Appendix- II.
- iii) The student opting for foundational course under sub-para (ii) will have to take admission under the centralized admission process for the said course.
- 9. Standard of Passing the Semester Examinations:-In order to pass a particular examination, a candidate shall have to secure at least 40% of marks in each and every Theory and Practical paper in the end semester examination, taken together with internal assessment marks in each paper. However, to be successful in the end semester examination the candidate needs to secure at least 50% marks in the aggregate marks of the semester. Where a candidate, therefore, fails in the end semester examination he/she will get exemption in only those passing heads in which he/she has secured 50% or more marks.
- 10. ATKT Rules :- Rules of promotion of students from the lower to the higher semester shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- 11. Evaluation System on the basis of Credit based Award Pattern: The academic performance of a student during a semester shall be graded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/her performance in external and internal examinations. The academic performance of a student during a semester and at the end of the programme, shall be evaluated on the basis of
 - i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject.
 - ii) Semester Grade Point Average(SGPA).
 - iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)



At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded to each student at the end of Final Semester of the Programme. The details regarding method of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in next para point.

- 12. Award of Grade Letter, Grade Points, Credit Points, SGPA, CGPA:
 - a) Award of Grade Letter and GradePoints:
 Each course/paper shall be valued in a 10 point grading system. The letter grades and their equivalent grade points are listed below.

- b) Calculation of Credit Points:Credit Points for the course = (No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Point secured for that course).
- a) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):- SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

SGPA= Total Credit Points in theSemester

Total Number of Credits for the Semester

b) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all thesemesters.

CGPA = Total Credit Points Obtained in all Semesters
Total Credits of allSemesters



The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

13. Award of the Degree: A student will be eligible for the award of the Degree of Master of Laws (LL.M) with his chosen specialization/s, after he has successfully completed the study all the four semesters. The mark sheets of the student shall specify the division and CGPA as per the following criterion.

i	First Division with Distinction	CGPA from 7.00 and above A+
ii	First Division	CGPA from 6.00 to 6.99 – AGrade
iii	Higher Second Division	CGPA from 5.50 to 5.99—B+Grade
iv	Pass/Second Division	CGPA from 5.00 to 5.49—BGrade

The degree shall specify the division secured by the student.

- 14. ABSORPTION SCHEME -The absorption of the students of all the old courses (regular students), whether Credit Based, Choice Based Credit Course or any other pattern shall be as per the scheme of absorbtion.
- 15. Saving: Notwithstanding the repeal of Direction No.14 of 2017 and introduction of new A.T.K.T. rules all the students who were admitted or absorbed in the LL.M. course under Direction No.14 of 2017 shall continue to be governed by the rules of A.T.K.T. thereunder for the academic year 2019-20. Thereafter, all such students also shall be governed by the A.T.K.T. rules hereunder.

DIRECTION GOVERNING ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF DEGREE OF MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M.)

[CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM] UNDER THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES.

[Direction issued by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public Universities. Act, 2016]

WHEREAS The Maharashtra Public Universities Act No. 6 of 2016 (Act VI of 2017) (hereinafter referred as an Act) has come into force with effect from 1st March, 2017;

AND

WHEREAS the University has been conferred with powers to introduce choice based credit system courses;

AND

WHEREAS, the University has adopted Credit Based Semester pattern for Master of Laws (LL.M) examination from the academic year 2012-13;

AND

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the University Grants Commission directed the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to initiate steps for successful implementation of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic session 2015-16 vide letter no. D.O.No. F-1-1/2015 (CM), dated 08/01/2015.

AND

WHEREAS the University Grants Commission has issued Guidelines on Adoption of Choice Based Credit System in all the Universities.

AND

WHEREAS the choice based credit system was introduced in the LL.M. course from the academic session 2016-17, vide Direction No. 61 of 2016



WHEREAS certain errors and shortcomings, not affecting the scheme of the course in the Direction 61 of 2016, were discovered during the implementation of the same and in the meeting of the task force held on 13th February 2017 it was decided to constitute a subcommittee to study the Direction and to suggest suitable clarifications in it;

AND

WHEREAS the subcommittee of the Task Force constituted for proposing clarification in the Direction no. 61of 2016 has submitted its report on 2nd March 2017 and the same was unanimously accepted by the Task Force in its meeting held on 29th April 2017;

AND

WHEREAS the University has issued a common Direction i.e. Direction NO. 13 of 2017, prescribing certain uniform norms for all the under graduate and post-graduate courses in all the faculties of the University;

AND

WHEREAS it is necessary to incorporate the uniform norms under Direction No. 13 of 2017 with respect to LL.M. course and also to incorporate the changes/clarifications suggested by the Task Force in law by issuing a new Direction;

Now, therefore, I, *Dr. Siddharthavinayaka P. Kane*, Vice-Chancellor, R.T.M. Nagpur University, Nagpur in exercise of the powers vested in me under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Universities Act, VI of 2017 do hereby issue the following Direction no 14. of 2017:

- 1. THE DIRECTION GOVERNING ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF DEGREE OF MASTER OF LAWS (LL.M.) [CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM]" IN THE FACULTY OF HUMANITIES, R.T.M. NAGPUR UNIVERSITY, NAGPUR.
- 2. Commencement and applicability of the Direction: It shall come into force from the date of its issuance and shall govern all the students who have taken admission in the CBCS course in the academic year 2016-17 and also the students taking admissions in the onward academic sessions.
- 3. Scope: This Direction shall apply to LL.M. Regular Course Students only.
- 4. Duration of the Programme: The duration of the LL.M programme shall be TWO academic years spreading over FOUR semesters with the University Examinations at the end of each Semester. Each Academic Year shall collected for two Semesters. The

academic Session for the Odd Semesters i.e. 1st & 3rd Semester, will commence as far as practicable from 1st of July every year and for the Even Semester i.e 2nd & 4th will commence, as far as practicable, from 1st of January every year.

An examination for each of the semester shall be held twice in a year at such places and on such dates as may be fixed by the University from time to time. The fees for the examination also shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.

- 5. Interpretation Clause: Unless the context otherwise require, the following words shall have the meaning as assigned to them in this clause.
 - (a) Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
 - **(b) ATKT:** means Allowed to Keep Term in Higher Semester as per the provisions of this direction.
 - (c) "Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): Choice Based Credit System provides Choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor Or soft skilled courses)" (See Appendix I attached with this direction)."
 - (d) Course: It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a programme. It is a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester. All courses need not carry the same weight. A course may be designed to comprise lecturing/tutorial/laboratory work/field work/outreach activities/project work/vocationaltraining/viva/seminars/termpapers/assignments/presentations/s elf-study etc. or a combination of some of these.
 - (e) Credit: Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly class hours assigned to a Course. One Credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching work (Lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
 - (f) Credit Point (CP): It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.
 - Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA means the value obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all the semesters by the total number of credits in all the semesters. It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters.

- (h) Grade Letter: Grade Letter means an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper into a letter grade. There shall be a range of marks for each Grade
- (i) Grade Point : Grade Point means weightage allotted to each grade letter.
- **Programme**: It means the Two Year Post Graduate Programme of study and examination spread over four semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of Master of Laws (LL.M.) degree.
- (k) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It means the value obtained by dividing the total credit points earned by a student in all the courses of a given semester by the total number of credits assigned to that semester. It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester.
- (l) Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate: Based on the grade earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.
- **6. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION:** A student desiring to seek admission to LL.M. Program, may either register himself/herself as a regular student in any of the institution established, or affiliated to the Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur, where LL.M course is being administered.

An applicant for admission to LL. M. programme should have obtained Bachelors Degree in Law (LL.B.) (Three Years) or B.A; LL.B. (Five Years) any other equivalent qualification, called by any name, which is recognized by the Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.

7. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS AND EXAMINATION: The medium of instruction and Examination for LL.M Course shall be English. An answer-book in the University examination written in any language other than English, shall not be eligible for valuation. It shall be deemed to be invalid for all practical purposes.

8. CHOICE BASED CREDIT COURSE:-

i). Every student taking admission as a regular student in the first semester of LL.M. course shall have to opt for anyone of the seven specialization enumerated in Appendix-I and which may be offered in the institution where the applicant student desire to take admission. The student will not be allowed to change his choice of specialization. The detail of the course

content for each specialization shall be as per the various tables mentioned in the said Appendix.

- ii). Each student of LL.M. course has to select and study one elective core course paper in third and fourth semester from the list of the electives provided for each semester or in the alternative the student can choose any one foundational course from the list of 41 foundational courses excluding the foundational course in law. The chosen foundational course will have one paper each in the third and fourth semester as shown in Appendix- II. iii. The student opting for foundational course under sub-para ii will have to take admission under the centralized admission process.
- **9. CRITERION FOR PASSING:** In order to be successful at the examination and to be eligible for the Degree of Master of Laws under this Direction, an examinee shall obtain minimum 40% marks in each paper (comprising the University examination and internal evaluation) and 50% marks in aggregate.

Therefore, where a student fails to pass the examination by securing minimum 50% aggregate marks, for being eligible for exemption in a paper, the candidate should obtain minimum 50% of marks in that paper/course.

10. ATKT Rules: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Direction or any other statute or ordinance for the time being in force, the admission of students to the LL.M course/program shall be on the yearly basis. Therefore, a student admitted to the FIRST semester and who undergoes the regular course of study of FIRST semester, certified by the head of the Institution where he/she is admitted, shall be allowed to be promoted to the SECOND semester without any condition. In order, however, to be eligible to be admitted to the THIRD semester, the student should have passed in at least 50% (Fifty Percent) of the total number of Papers/subjects/courses of the First and the second semester taken together.

A student admitted to the THIRD semester and who undergoes the regular course of study of third semester, certified by the head of the Institution where he/she is admitted, shall be allowed to be promoted to the FOURTH semester without any condition.

- 11. Evaluation System on the basis of Credit based Award Pattern: The academic performance of a student during a semester shall be graded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/her performance in external and internal examinations. The academic performance of a student during a semester and at the end of the programme, shall be evaluated on the basis of:
 - (i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject
 - (ii) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA),



(iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded to each student at the end of Final Semester of the Programme. The details regarding method of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in para 10.

12. Award of Grade Letter, Grade Points, Credit Points, SGPA, CGPA:

(a) Award of Grade Letter and Grade Points:

Each course/paper shall be valued in a 10 point grading system. The letter grades and their equivalent grade points are listed below.

(b) Calculation of Credit Points :-

Credit Points for the course = (No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Point secured for that course.)

- (c) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) :- SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.
 - SGPA = <u>Total Credit Points in the Semester</u> Total Number of Credits for the Semester
- (d) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

13. Award of the Degree: A student will be eligible for the award of the Degree of Master of Laws (LL.M) with his chosen specialization/s, after he has successfully completed all the four semesters. The degree shall specify the division and CGPA of successful candidates as per the following criterion:

i. First Division with Distinction: CGPA from 7.00 and above – A+

ii. First Division: CGPA from 6.00 to 6.99—A Grade

iii. Higher Second Division: CGPA from 5.50 to 5.99—B+ Grade

iv. Pass /Second Division: CGPA from 5.00 to 5.49—B Grade

- **14. ABSORPTION SCHEME: -** The absorption of the students admitted to the old credit based course and choice based course shall be as follows:-
- 1. All the students who had taken admission in the Choice Based Credit System under Direction No. 61 of 2016 shall be absorbed in the Choice Based Credit Course under this Direction 14/2017
- 2. The students who were admitted to the LL.M. credit course (CBS) during the 2015-16 session and also failure of the old batches shall continue to be governed by the old CBS course and old pattern. However, such Students shall be required to complete their course

within the three consecutive sessions i.e. 2016-17, 2017-18 & 2018-19. As such these students shall be getting 6 consecutive University examinations to complete their LL.M. Course.

- 3. The students of the old CBS course who fail to complete their LL.M. course within the time permissible under Para above shall be absorbed in the new choice based credit based, letter grade pattern course (CBCS) and they will be granted exemption in the equivalent COMPULSORY CORE AND OPTIONAL CORE COURSES papers respectively.
- 4. The presents absorption scheme shall be valid till a new absorption scheme is proposed in future.
- 15 Repeal:- With the coming into force of this Direction the Direction No. 61 of 2016 shall stand repealed. Notwithstanding repeal of the Direction No. 61 of 2016 all actions taken under the said Direction shall remain valid for all practical purposes.

APPENDIX I

LL.M COURSE (CHOISE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM)

In LL.M course (choice based credit system), there are **seven** specialization groups, out of which one group has to be opted by the students at the time of admission. they are:

- 1) GROUP A- INTERNATIONAL LAW
- 2) GROUP B- CONSTITUTIONAL LAW AND ADMINISTRATIVE LAW
- 3) GROUP C- INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAWS.
- 4) GROUP D- BUSINESS LAW
- 5) GROUP E- ENVIRONMENT AND LEGAL ORDER
- 6) GROUP F- LABOUR, CAPITAL AND LAW
- 7) GROUP G-CRIMINAL LAW

(In each of the group 25 students will be admitted on merit)

Each student taking admission to the LLM course has to study eight compulsory courses irrespective of the specialization which he/she has chosen. Out of the eight compulsory courses, two compulsory courses are prescribed for first semester, two compulsory courses are prescribed for second semester, two compulsory courses are prescribed for third semester and two compulsory courses are prescribed for fourth semester.

Further in each group of specialization, there are six optional core courses representing specializations offered and which are required to be studied for that specializations. Apart from the compulsory and the optional core course papers, the students have to select and study one elective core course paper in third and fourth semester each to be selected from the list of the electives provided for each semester or in the alternative the student can choose any one foundational course from the list of 41 foundational courses excluding the foundational course in law. The chosen foundational course will have one paper each in the third and fourth semester as shown in Appendix II. (List of foundational courses is given in Appendix II)

Therefore, any student pursuing LLM CBCS course will have to study eight compulsory courses, six optional core courses and two elective core courses or in alternative, to the elective core courses, two papers of the chosen foundational courses.

The candidates will have to prosecute regular full time course of study. All the courses prescribed herein carries 100 marks each. However for every theory paper out the total 100 marks 20 marks shall be awarded for internal assessment and the remaining 80 marks shall be for the university theory examination. The breakup of the 100 marks for other courses shall be as shown against those courses in the table no. 17 and 27 herein.

In order to be successful at the examination and to be eligible for the degree of master of laws, an examinee shall obtain a minimum of 40% marks an each paper/course and obtain

50% marks in aggregate to be declared successful. The required minimum passing marks for each paper shall be calculated by combining the marks scored in the internal assessment with the university theory examination marks. (i.e. to say passing marks(40%), exemption (50%) = university theory + internal assessment). were a student's fails to pass the examination, for being eligible for exemption in a paper, the candidate should obtain minimum 50% of marks in that paper/course.
